Milk Production Continues to Increase

June Milk Production Up 5.0%

Estimated United States milk production during June totaled 15.0 billion pounds, up 5.0% from June 2004.

U.S. production per cow is estimated at 1,659 pounds for June, up 73 pounds, or 4.6%, from a year earlier.

The estimated number of cows on U.S. farms in June was 9.0 million head, 34,000 head more than June 2004 and 13,000 head more than May 2005.

For the top six milk producing states, production in June 2005, compared to June 2004, was up 12% in Idaho, 8% in Pennsylvania, 5% in Wisconsin and California, 4% in New York, and 3% in Minnesota.

January-June Up 3.2%

U.S. milk production for the first six months of 2005, estimated at 88.9 billion pounds, was up 3.2% from the same period in 2004, when adjusted for leap year. The increased production resulted from a slight increase in milk cow numbers, and a 2.4% average increase in daily milk production per cow.

Outlook on Milk Production

In the monthly "World Agricultural Supply & Demand Estimates" report issued by USDA, 2005 milk production is forecast at 175.2 billion pounds, up 2.9% from a year ago (adjusted for leap year). Production for 2006 is forecast to grow another 2.3% to 179.3 billion pounds.

Pool Summary

- In June, 14,491 producers delivered to the market with an average daily delivery of 4,656 pounds.
- Producer milk totaled 1.85 billion pounds, down 419 million pounds from May and 267 million pounds below June 2004.
- Class I utilization totaled 341 million pounds, down 3.5% on a daily basis

from May. Class I usage accounted for 18.4% of producer milk.

- The June Producer Price Differential (PPD) is \$0.20 per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price is \$14.12 per cwt., up \$0.07 from May, but \$3.86 below June 2004.
- Market statistics for June are shown on Pages 4 and 5.

Partial Final Decision to Amend the Arizona-Las Vegas Milk Marketing Order

The U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) recently announced a partial final decision that permanently adopts an amendment to the pooling provisions of the Arizona-Las Vegas Milk Order that previously were implemented on an interim basis.

This decision is based on testimony and evidence given at a public hearing held at Tempe, Arizona, on September 23-25, 2003; reconvened at Seattle, Washington, on November 17-21, 2003; and

reconvened at Alexandria, Virginia., on January 20-22, 2004.

This partial final decision permanently adopts an amendment to the producer milk provision that would eliminate the ability to simultaneously pool milk on the Arizona-Las Vegas Milk Order when the same milk is already pooled on a State-operated milk order that has marketwide pooling. The partial final decision was published in the June 27 *Federal Register*. USDA is in the

process of determining if producers approve of the amended order.

Sales of Fluid Milk Products

Sales of fluid milk products in the Upper Midwest Order in 2004 are shown graphically below with sales in all Federal orders and in California shown on Page 3.

Upper Midwest Order

During 2004, there were 4.3 billion pounds of fluid milk products sold in

the marketing area from all sources. On a monthly basis, sales averaged 362 million pounds during the year, ranging from 329 million pounds in June to 385 million pounds in December.

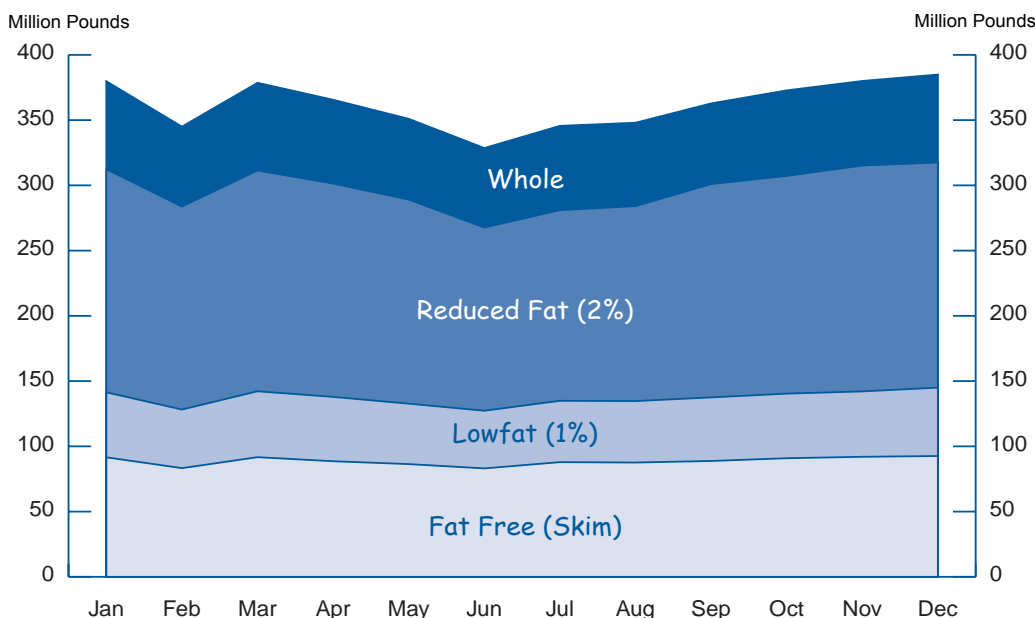
Sales of reduced fat milk (2%) accounted for the largest share of the market at 44%, followed by fat free (skim), whole, and lowfat (1%).

All Orders & California

Packaged sales of fluid milk products in all marketing areas and California totaled 50.3 billion pounds for the year.

Sales in each of the areas and the percentage they represented are shown in the graph on Page 3. The largest sales occurred in F.O. 1, the Northeast Order.

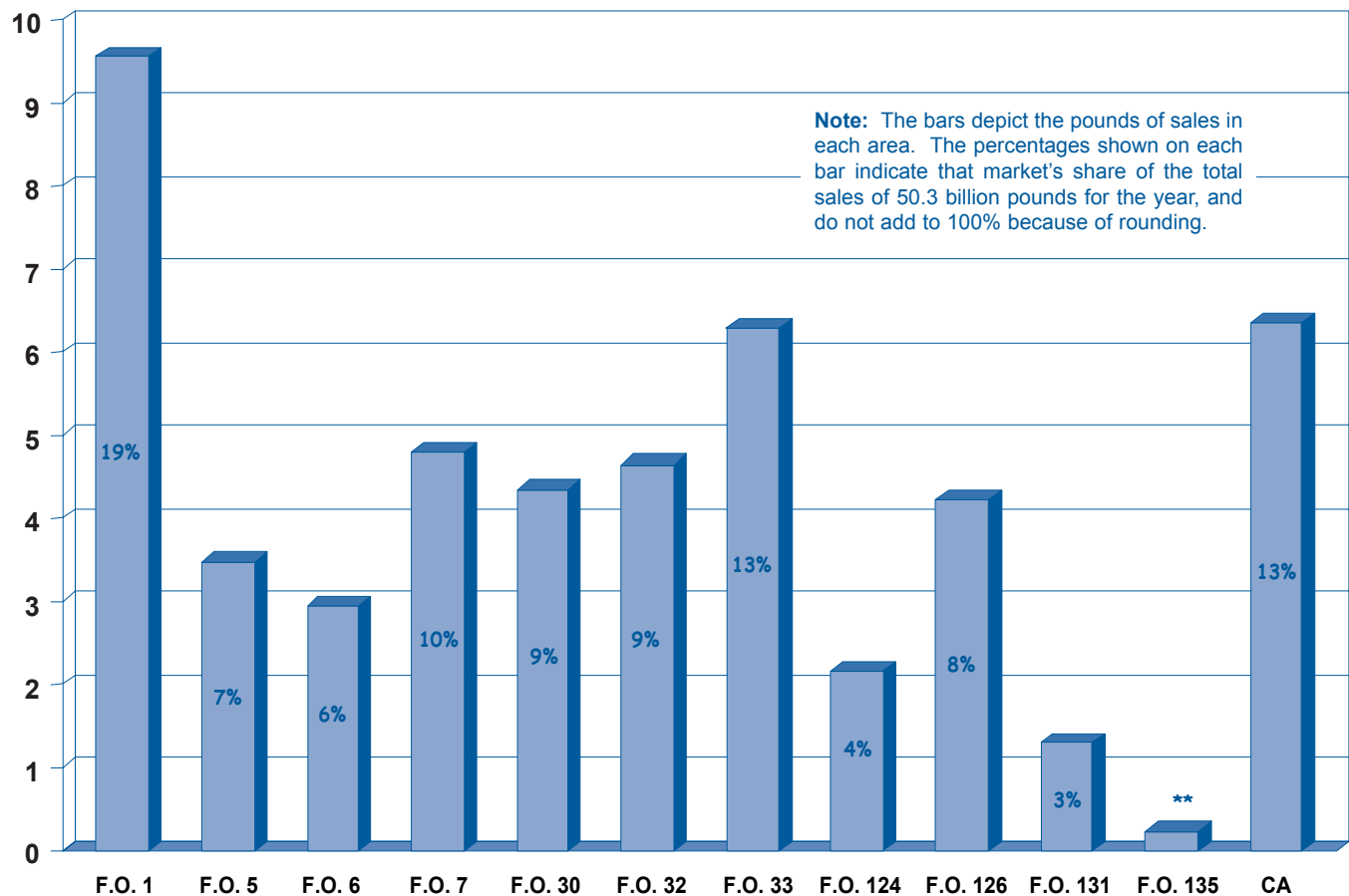
Packaged Sales of Fluid Milk Products in the Upper Midwest Marketing Area from all Sources -- 2004

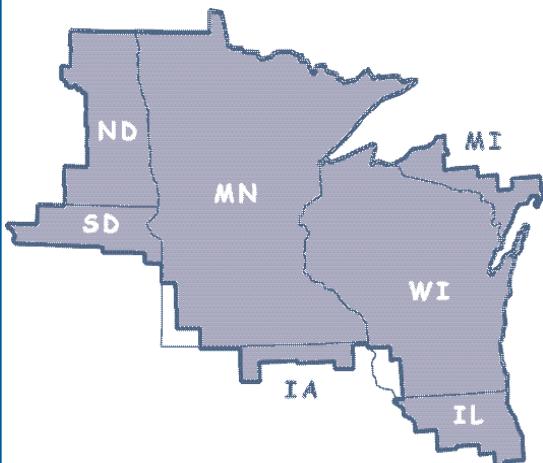
