USDA Announces Three Final Decisions

Upper Midwest Final Decision

The U.S. Department of Agriculture recently issued a final decision for the Upper Midwest Marketing Area, published in the *Federal Register* on September 13, 2006.

The decision proposes to adopt as a final rule, amendments to the pooling provisions of the Upper Midwest Marketing Area that were previously discussed in a recommended decision. Specifically, this decision recommends adoption of amendments that would:

- 1) Establish a limit on the volume of milk a handler may pool during the months of April through February to 125% of the volume of milk pooled in the prior month;
- 2) Establish a limit on the volume of milk a handler may pool during the month of March to 135% of the volume of milk pooled in the prior month; and
- 3) Allow the market administrator to increase the administrative assessment up

to a maximum of 8 cents per hundredweight on all pooled milk, if necessary, to maintain the required fund reserves.

The decision is based on testimony and evidence given at a public hearing in Bloomington, Minnesota in August 2004. A partial decision issued earlier dealt with other issues from this same hearing.

USDA will conduct a vote on the amended order to determine producer approval. If producers approve the order as amended by this final decision, a final rule will follow to implement these changes on a permanent basis.

Pool Summary

- ➤ In August, 17,293 producers delivered to the market with an average daily delivery of 4,512 pounds.
- ➤ Producer milk totaled 2.4 billion pounds, up 120 million pounds from July, and 245 million pounds above August 2005.
- Class I utilization totaled 388 million pounds, up 12.3% from July. Class I
- usage accounted for 16.1% of producer milk.
- ➤ The August Producer Price Differential (PPD) is \$0.37 per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price is \$11.43 per cwt., up \$0.13 from July, but \$2.72 below August 2005.
- ➤ Market statistics for August are shown on Pages 4 and 5.

Final Decision to Amend Central Milk Order

The U.S. Department of Agriculture recently announced a final decision to permanently adopt amendments to the pooling provisions of the Central Milk Marketing Order. This decision is based on testimony and evidence given at a public hearing held in Kansas City, Missouri in December 2004.

Specifically, this decision recommends adoption of amendments that would:

- 1) Increase supply plant performance standards;
- 2) Amend features of the "touch base" provision;
- Amend certain features of the "split plant provision"; and
- **4)** Decrease the diversion limit standards of the order.

The decision also adopts a proposal that limits the volume of milk a handler can pool in a month to 125% of the total volume of milk pooled in the previous month.

The final decision was published in the *Federal Register* on September 13, 2006.

USDA will conduct a vote to determine producer approval. If producers approve the order as amended by this final decision, a final rule will follow to implement these changes on a permanent basis.

Final Decision to Amend Mideast Milk Order

The U.S. Department of Agriculture recently announced a final decision to permanently adopt amendments to the pooling provisions of the Mideast Milk Marketing Order. This decision is based on testimony and evidence given at a public hearing held in Wooster, Ohio in March 2005.

Specifically, this decision recommends adoption of amendments that would:

 Establish a limit on the volume of milk a handler may pool during the months of April through February to 115% of the volume of milk pooled in the prior month; and

2) Establish a limit on the volume of milk a handler may pool during the month of March to 120% of the volume of milk pooled in the prior month.

The final decision was published in the *Federal Register* on September 13, 2006.

USDA will conduct a vote on the amended order to determine producer approval. If producers approve the

order as amended by this final decision, a final rule will follow to implement these changes on a permanent basis.

Tentative Partial Decision to Amend Appalachian and Southeast Milk Orders

The U.S. Department of Agriculture recently announced a tentative partial decision that recommends amendments to the transportation credit provisions of the Appalachian and Southeast Milk Marketing Orders. This decision is based on testimony and evidence given at a public hearing held in Louisville, Kentucky in January 2006.

This decision adopts, on an interim final and emergency basis, proposals to amend certain features of the transportation credit provisions of the Appalachian and Southeast Orders. Specifically, this decision will:

 Establish a mileage rate factor using a fuel cost adjustor used in the transportation credit provisions of both orders;

- Increase the maximum transportation credit assessment rate for both orders; and
- Establish diversion limits on eligible Class I milk receiving transportation credits.

A separate decision will be issued addressing proposals concerning producer milk provisions and transportation credits on intra-market order movement of milk within the Appalachian and Southeast Milk Marketing Areas.

The tentative partial decision was published in the *Federal Register* on September 13, 2006.

Interested persons have until November 13 to file comments in response to the tentative partial decision. USDA will

determine if producers approve the amended order.

CME Cheese, Butter Increase Slightly

Prices for cheddar cheese on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) increased slightly from mid-August to mid-September.

The CME barrel price on September 15 was \$1.27½ per pound, up 6¾¢ from mid-August, while the 40-pound block price of \$1.27¼ was up 6¼¢ from mid-August. The year-earlier levels for CME barrel and block prices were \$1.50 and \$1.59¾, respectively.

The CME butter price on September 15 was \$1.31 per pound, up 2ϕ from mid-August. The year-earlier level for the CME butter price was \$1.72, more than 40ϕ above current levels.

According to USDA's "Dairy Products" report, July butter production nationwide was down more than 37% from January levels. Butter stocks in CME-approved warehouses were also down nearly 30% in the last eight weeks.

The August Federal order Class III price of \$11.06 per cwt. was up 14¢ from July, but \$2.54 below the August 2005 price.

According to the "World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates" from USDA, Class III prices for 2007 are projected to average \$12.50 (+/- 50¢), up from \$11.70 (+/- 10¢) in 2006.
