

Cheese and Butter Prices Decline

Prices for cheddar cheese and butter on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) started to decline after rising slightly in the early part of January.

The CME barrel cheddar cheese price on January 20 was \$1.50 1 /₄ per pound, down 4^{1} /₄¢ from December 20. The price for 40-pound blocks was \$1.50 1 /₂ per pound on January 20, down 5^{3} /₄¢ from December 20. The barrel price was 1^{1} /₂¢ above the year-earlier level, and the block price was 1^{1} /₂¢ above a year ago.

On January 20, the CME butter price closed

at \$1.57 per pound, down $2^{1/2}$ ¢ from December 20 and 53¢ below the year-earlier level.

The December Federal order Class III price was \$18.77 per cwt., down 30¢ from November, but \$4.94 above December 2010.

The January CME Class III futures price on January 20 was \$17.10 per cwt., with February through June ranging from \$16.41 to \$17.15 per cwt. The CME Class III futures prices for the second half of the year currently average about \$17.20 per cwt.

Preliminary 2011 Milk Production Up Almost 2%

Preliminary U.S. Department of Agriculture estimates indicate total United States milk production for 2011 was a record-high 196 billion pounds, an increase of 1.8% from 2010.

The gain in milk production was driven by an increase in both milk per cow and the average number of milk cows. For the top ten milk producing states, 2011 production, compared to the previous year, was up 8.5% in Texas, 4.5% in Washington, 3.8% in New Mexico, 3.7% in Idaho, 2.7% in California, 1.8% in Michigan, 0.9% in New York, and 0.3% in Wisconsin, but down 1.2% in Pennsylvania and 2.2% in Minnesota.

Final estimates will be released in February.

Pool Summary

- ➤ In December, producer milk totaled 2.5 billion pounds, down 180 million pounds from November and 247 million pounds below December 2010.
- Class I utilization totaled 370 million pounds, down 2.1% from November on a daily basis. Class I usage accounted for 14.7% of producer milk.
- Class III utilization totaled 1.9 billion

- pounds and accounted for 75.6% of producer milk.
- ➤ The December Producer Price Differential (PPD) was \$(0.06) per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price was \$18.71 per cwt., down \$0.44 from November, but \$4.30 above December 2010.

2011 Annual Utilization and Classification

Annual utilization and classification for 2010 and 2011 are summarized and compared in the table on Page 2. The annual numbers represent the sum of monthly data.

Class I Utilization - Class I producer milk in 2011 was 4.24 billion pounds, down 3.2% from the previous year. Class I use includes milk sold to consumers in fluid form.

Total Class I packaged disposition fell 3.1% during 2011. The disposition of all packaged milk products decreased in 2011 except for lowfat milk, which increased 4.2% from the previous year. However, the increase in the sales of lowfat milk was more than offset by the decreases in the disposition of all the other categories of packaged milk products.

Most packaged sales of milk continue to be reduced fat milk, accounting for 35.8% of total packaged sales, followed by fat free milk at 24.1%, low fat milk at 16.7%, and whole milk at 12.5%. Other categories combined made up the remaining 10.9% of packaged sales.

Class I use in 2011 accounted for 12.9% of total producer milk (as shown in Figure 1), down from 13.0% in 2010. The 2011 percentage of

Market Class I

Class I utilization is the lowest in this market since market reform in 2000.

Class II Utilization - Class II producer milk in 2011 totaled 1.05 billion pounds, up 320 million pounds or 43.9% from 2010. Class II use primarily includes fluid cream products, ice cream, cottage cheese, and yogurt. Class II producer milk accounted for 3.2% of total producer milk during the year.

Class III Utilization

- Class III producer milk in 2011 was 26.99 billion pounds, down 1.31 billion pounds or 4.6% from 2010. Class III utilization primarily includes milk used for the manufacture of hard cheeses, and accounted for 82.4% of producer milk.

Class IV Utilization -

Class IV producer milk in 2011 totaled 482 million pounds, up 97 million pounds or 25.3% from 2010. Class IV utilization primarily includes butter and all dried milk products. Class IV producer


milk accounted for 1.5% of producer milk.

Producer Milk - Total producer milk in 2011 of 32.8 billion pounds was down 1.0 billion pounds, or 3.1% from 2010.

Butterfat - 3.73% Protein - 3.06% Other Solids - 5.74% Nonfat Solids - 8.80%


