Dairy Commodity Prices Stabilize

Prices for cheddar cheese on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) for both 500 pound barrels and 40-pound blocks have settled around \$2.00 per pound over the last few months after reaching record highs in mid-March. During these same few months, the price of butter has risen drastically, peaking at \$2.50 on June 30 before settling back slightly in the weeks since. Nonfat dry milk (NFDM) prices have generally been declining gradually since reaching \$2.11 per pound in December 2013. (see graph below).


On July 16, the CME barrel cheese price closed at \$2.04 per pound, up 8¢ from a

month earlier. The 40-pound block price of \$2.00\% on July 16 was down 1\%\psi\$ from a month ago.

The CME butter price closed at \$2.39 per pound on July 16, 20½¢ above a month earlier. The Grade A nonfat dry milk (NFDM) price was down 9¢ from a month earlier, at \$1.73½ per pound on July 16.

The June Federal order Class III price of \$21.36 per cwt. was down \$1.21 from May but was \$3.34 higher than June 2013. The July 16 CME Class III futures market has the price at \$21.46 for July and declining thereafter, but remaining above \$19.00 through December.

Pool Summary

- ➤ In June, producer milk totaled 2.9 billion pounds, down 139 million pounds from May, but 53 million pounds above June 2013.
- ➤ Class I utilization totaled 264 million pounds, down 9.2% from May on a daily basis and 1.7% below last year. Class I usage accounted for 9.1% of producer milk.
- Class III utilization totaled 2.6 billion

- pounds and accounted for 88.5% of producer milk.
- ➤ The June Producer Price Differential (PPD) was \$0.43 per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price was \$21.79 per cwt., down \$1.21 from May, but \$3.47 above June 2013.
- Market statistics for June are shown on Pages 2, 4, and 5.

2013 Annual Dairy Products Summary

The National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) recently published the "Dairy Products 2013 Summary", which details the monthly production of specified dairy products in the United States.

The table on Page 3 shows annual production and number of plants manufacturing selected dairy products in the United States for 2013 and 2012. Selected items from the table are summarized below. A breakdown of the information by state is included in the report, which is available on the NASS website at:

Butter production in the United States during 2013 totaled 1.9 billion pounds, 0.2% above 2012. California accounted for 34% of butter production in 2013.

Total cheese production in 2013, excluding cottage cheeses, was 11.1 billion pounds, 2.0% above 2012. Wisconsin was the leading cheese producing state with 26% of the production, followed by California with 21%, Idaho with 8%, New York and New Mexico with 7% each, and Minnesota with 6%.

American type cheese production was 4.4 billion pounds, 1.5% above 2012. American cheese accounted for 40% of total cheese production in 2013. Wisconsin was the leading American cheese producing state with 19% of the production, followed by Idaho and California with 14% each.

Italian cheese varieties production of 4.7 billion pounds in 2013 was 2.2% above 2012. Italian Cheese accounted for 43% of total cheese production in 2013. Mozzarella accounted for 78% of the Italian production, followed by

Provolone with 8% and Parmesan with 7%. California was the leading Italian cheese producing state with 31% of the production, followed by Wisconsin with 30%.

Nonfat dry milk production for human food, at 1.5 billion pounds, was down 16.2% from 2012. However, much of this decline was offset by increases in dry whole milk and skim milk powder production. California was the leading state with 39% of total production.

Dry whey production for human consumption totaled 924 million pounds, and was down 2.3% from 2012. Wisconsin was the leading state with 33% of total production. New York also accounted for a large percentage of the dry whey production with 16%.

Combined Ice Cream and Ice Cream Mix production (regular and lowfat) totaled 2.4 billion gallons and was down 1.3% from 2012. California was the leading state with 11% of total production. Pennsylvania had the second highest production, with just over 3% of the national total.


