NFDM Price Rises Further while Butter & Cheese Prices Fall

Commodity prices for NFDM and Whey on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) are up in September, while the butter, block and barrel cheese prices continued to decline. Comparing prices to last September, barrel, block, and butter prices were down while NFDM and whey prices were up. See the graph below.

The CME barrel price for cheddar cheese on September 18 was \$1.45 $\frac{1}{4}$ per pound, down 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ ¢ from August and 18 $\frac{3}{4}$ ¢ below last year. The CME 40-pound block price for cheddar cheese was \$1.35 per pound, down 22 $\frac{3}{4}$ ¢

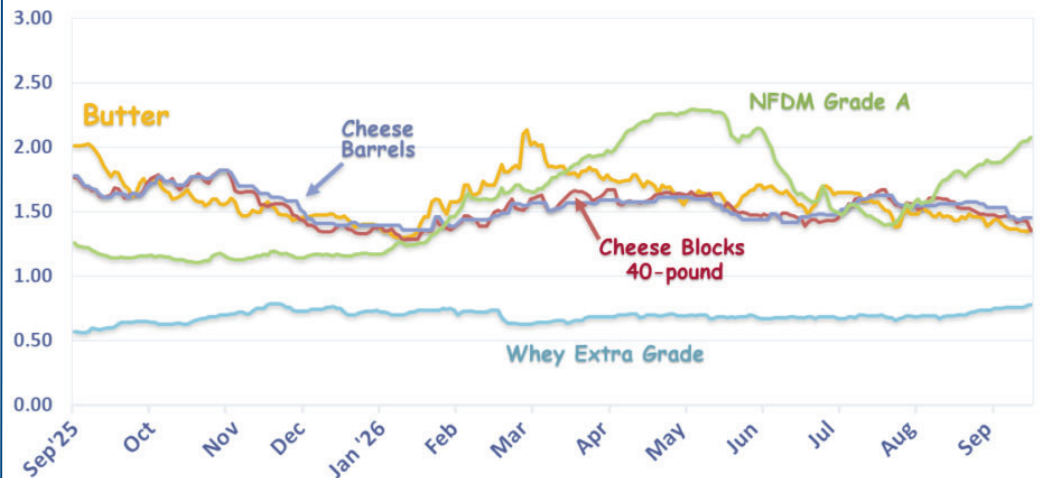
from last month and 33 $\frac{1}{4}$ ¢ below last year.

The CME butter price on September 18 was \$1.37 per pound, 9¢ below last month and 43 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ below last year.

The CME price for NFDM on September 18 was \$2.08 per pound, up 30¢ from August and 93 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ above last year.

The CME whey price on September 18 was \$0.78 per pound, up 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ from last month and 15¢ above last year.

Pool Summary

- In August, producer milk was 2.8 billion pounds, up 1.8% daily from July and 9.1% above last August.
- Class I use was 156 million pounds, down 0.8% daily from July and 0.5% below last year. In August, Class I use was 5.7% of total producer milk.
- The August 2026 Producer Price Differential (PPD) was \$0.60 per cwt.
- The F.O. 30 Statistical Uniform Price in August was \$17.24 per cwt., up \$0.84 from July, but \$0.58 below last year. [Federal Order language](#) was amended effective June 2025 and December 2025.
- Market statistics for July and August are shown on Pages 4 and 5.

2025 Sales of Fluid Milk Products

Sales of fluid milk products (FMP) in the Upper Midwest Order from all sources are shown in Table 1 and are depicted graphically in Figures 1 and 2, with sales in all Federal orders shown in Figure 3 on Page 3.

Upper Midwest Order

During 2025, there were 2.9 billion pounds of fluid milk products sold in the marketing area from all sources. On a monthly basis, 2025 sales ranged from 213 million pounds in June to 264 million pounds in December.

In 2025, sales averaged 240 million pounds per month, up from 238 million pounds in 2024 but below 366 million pounds in 2000, as shown in Figure 2. Since 2000, monthly average annual sales peaked at 371.5 million pounds in 2007 and had declined steadily since until 2025 which finally saw an uptick.

Sales of reduced fat milk (2%) continued to account for the largest share of the market at 32.8% in 2025, followed by whole milk, then lowfat milk (1%), and last was fat free milk (skim) by a fair margin.

Sales of 2%, 1%, and skim milk declined in this region from 2024 to 2025, while sales of whole milk increased. The large increase in sales of whole milk was enough to offset the decline in the other three categories, causing an increase in total sales for the year.

All Orders

Packaged sales of fluid milk products in all marketing areas totaled 39.2 billion pounds for the year. Sales in each of the areas and the percentage they represented are shown in Figure 3 on Page 3.

Marketing Area from all Sources -- 2025

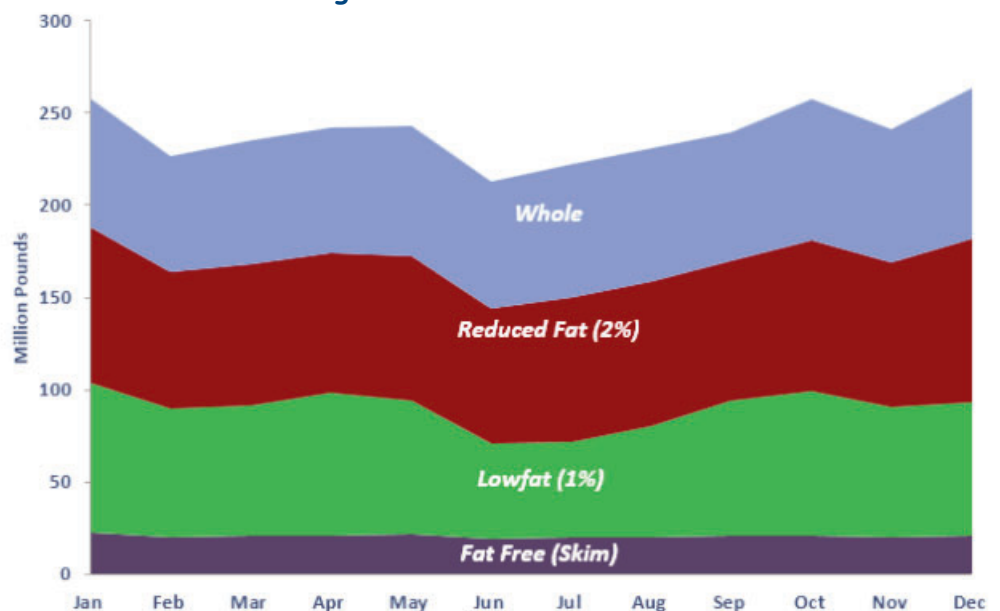
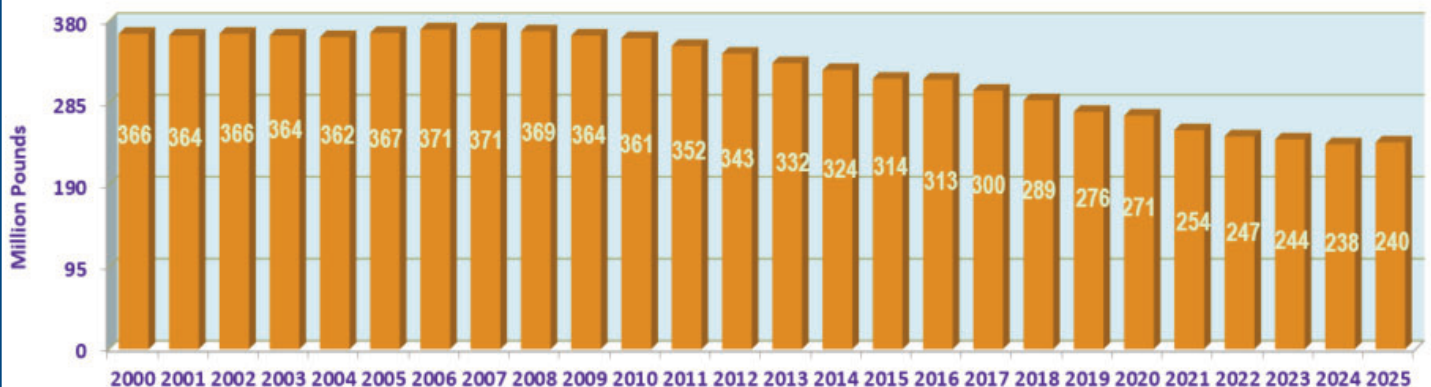

Milk Hauling Charges -- May 2026

The Upper Midwest Order has a forthcoming staff paper prepared by Dr. Areerat Kichkha, an agricultural economist on staff. Staff Paper 26-02, entitled *Milk Hauling Charges in the Upper Midwest Marketing Area - May 2026* will be available at:

The study, summarized in this article, analyzes hauling charges based on state, county, and producer size groups for May 2026. Payroll data for the 7,526 producers associated with the Upper Midwest Marketing Order during the month were examined.

Hauling Charges for the Market

The weighted average hauling charge for producers on the Upper Midwest Order in May 2026, shown in Table 1 on this page, was 52.60¢ per cwt., up from 50.87¢ in May 2025. Hauling charges have gradually increased each year since 2015, with the exception of 2020 when they took a slight dip. However, the weighted average hauling charges over the years have also shown that handlers have passed on little of the changes in fuel costs to farmers, despite the higher increase in average hauling charges and fuel price surge in May 2026.

Hauling Charges by State

The Wisconsin weighted average hauling charge of 49.64¢ per cwt. was 2.96¢ below the market average, while the Minnesota weighted average of 43.06¢ was 9.54¢ below the market. These two states supplied 78.6% of the milk on the market in May 2026, and accounted for 71.7% of total hauling charges.

North Dakota has the highest simple average hauling charge. The state also has a low number of farms, the longest distance from high demand areas, and less handler competition. Wisconsin and Minnesota, in contrast, have the two lowest simple average hauling charges with high numbers of farms in close

proximity to high demand areas.

Hauling Charges by Size Range

As shown in Table 2, average hauling charges per hundred-weight generally decrease as producer milk volume increases. One contributing factor is that many Upper Midwest handlers assess a fixed hauling charge regardless of milk volume. As production increases, this charge is spread over more hundred-weight, lowering the per-unit charge. However, its impact cannot be isolated with the available data.

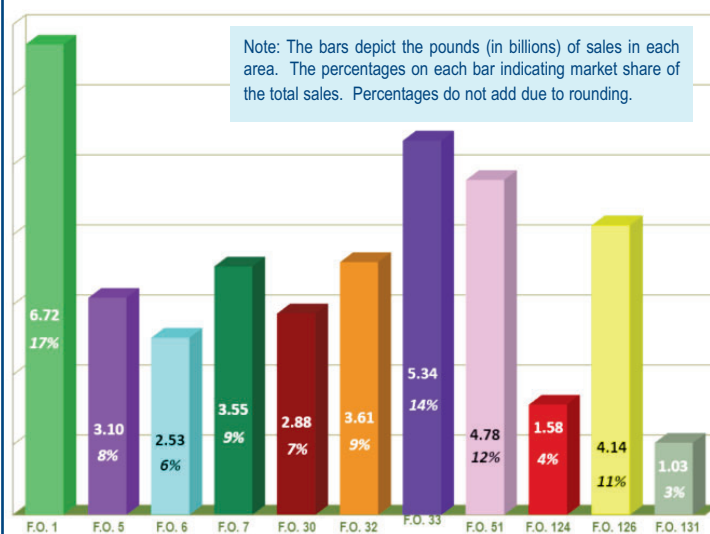
This inverse relationship may vary slightly across size ranges. Although milk volume increases across the fourth through eighth size ranges, fewer producers had zero hauling charges in May 2026, raising average charges in some ranges. These deviations from the overall inverse relationship were only a few cents per hundredweight.
